WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! We are now in the season of Epiphany. At Christmas God gave His very best Gift. Epiphany is the unwrapping of that Gift to see what God has given, to thank Him for His Gift, and to put His Gift to use. We are glad you are here with us this morning! Grace is a family of believers dedicated to sharing the Good News of salvation in Jesus. We believe and confess that this is done as the Means of Grace, God's Word and Sacraments are shared and administered in their truth and purity. Living as His people we bear witness to His love and mercy shown to us and to all.
