### **WELCOME**

**Welcome to everyone!** “What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him.” In our Gospel reading for today this is the way the people reacted to the powerful teaching of Jesus. That teaching of Jesus continues today wherever His Word is read and preached. Today we are strengthened in that Word as we come together for Divine Service, for that Word does not return to Him void, but accomplishes the task for which it was sent, the creation of faith and the strengthening of that faith through the forgiveness of sins.

It is good to have you here this morning, especially our guests and visitors. If you are visiting with us we pray that you will be comforted by the Good News of Jesus and the salvation that He freely gives. **Holy Communion** is celebrated in our 8:15 Service this morning. If you are not a member of Grace and desire to receive this Sacrament of Christ's body and blood given and shed for the forgiveness of sins, we ask that you first speak with our Pastor so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

### **AS WE GATHER**

When the Israelites were about to enter the Promised Land and Moses was about to die, he announced that the Lord had promised another prophet to follow him. While the people saw Joshua as that prophet, and most certainly he did succeed Moses, centuries later, Jesus was the complete fulfillment of the prophecy. When He spoke, all creation—including unclean spirits—obeyed to the amazement of the people in today's Gospel account from St. Mark. Unfortunately, as St. Paul reminds us in the Epistle, we do not always hear a clear command from our Lord as we deal with one another. But Jesus' once and for all sacrifice for us frees us to put our neighbor's needs above our own. As He has served us we are called to serve one another and in so doing we are responding to the authority of the One who has broken the darkness of sin and unbelief!
