WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! We are truly glad that You are with us this morning and we pray that You will be blessed through the hearing of God's Word which creates and sustains faith. God gives us our daily bread in two ways. First we are given those things that we need to support this body and life as He opens His hands and satisfies our desires. Secondly He gives us His Word in which we find His promise and His promise fulfilled in Jesus unto eternal life. Let us continually taste and see that the Lord is good! Holy Communion will be celebrated in the 8:15 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

As we live out each day, we reflect on our faith in our words and actions. Each of us is an example of the Christian life as we struggle to live in forgiving love toward one another, and also as we continue to trust in the forgiveness Christ won for us and freely gives to us. In today's Old Testament Reading, Elijah almost gives up, but he is strengthened with miraculous food. Then in the Epistle, Paul provides a list of what our life in Christ should look like because of our new birth in Holy Baptism. In the Gospel, Jesus spells out the connection between receiving His body and blood in the Lord's Supper and living in hope each day rather than in despair. He is the bread of life from heaven, who enables each of us to discard our old ways, live in the new life of God's forgiving love, and adorn ourselves with gladness, giving thanks to God for keeping His promises to us in Christ!





FOOD PANTRY – We continue to receive requests for assistance from our Food Pantry. Thank you for your donations to fill these needs. Following are items that need to be replenished in our pantry: Canned **chunky** soups (no creamed soups), meats, fruits, vegetables, peanut butter, jellies, and individual fruit and pudding cups.



Lutheran World Relief

The Women Of Grace (formerly LWML) will be collecting school supplies again this year to send to areas in need. In 2017, 214,490 school kits were sent to 15 different countries. These families often need to choose between a meal or buying supplies for school. If they don't have the supplies they need, they often cannot attend school. Grace Lutheran has an ingathering every year to collect kits from area churches. These kits are loaded onto a truck and shipped to one of LWR's warehouses in Minnesota or Maryland. Here they are sorted, checked and repacked for efficient shipping. LWR staff work with partners overseas to determine where and what items are most needed. Once prepared for shipment, they travel by ocean freight to the receiving partner in countries around the world. Here they are cleared through customs, and transferred to storage until they can be distributed according to local needs. Much care and effort goes into each kit to ensure it arrives to the intended recipient in good shape.

Supplies needed for each kit include:

- 4- 70 count notebooks
- 1-ruler (with cm or cm and inches)
- 1-pencil sharpener
- 1-blunt tip 5 inch scissors
- 5-pencils
- 5- ball point pens
- 1-pink eraser
- 1-box crayons
- 1-drawstring backpack (14inx17in)



Thank you in advance for all you do to make this possible. Our goal this year is 75+ kits from Grace.

If anyone is interested in sewing backpacks for these kits, I can supply you with the cut fabric and instructions to make them.
