AS WE GATHER

Ruth was a Moabite who had married a Hebrew from Bethlehem. He died and so she was a widow along with Naomi, her mother-in-law and Orpah, her sister-in-law. When given the chance to return to her own people rather than accompany her mother-in-law back to Bethlehem she pledged faithful love not just to Naomi but also to Naomi's God. Maybe you have heard these words before, they are Ruth's; "For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the Lord do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you." In the Rite of Confirmation we pledge a similar loyalty to the God of Naomi and Ruth, the God who gave His Son into death for us.

TODAY IN SUNDAY SCHOOL - The account of Jacob’s favorite son, Joseph, serves as today’s lesson, “Hope in Hardship.” This account occupies a turning point in the history of God’s people. The unusual timeline of Joseph’s life includes him being despised by his brothers, being sold into slavery, attaining success and then losing it all to false accusations, being imprisoned, and serving in the court of Pharaoh. Joseph summarizes his life in one sentence addressed to his brothers, “You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good” (Genesis 50:20). Discuss how God can use negative things for our benefit.
