**WELCOME**

**Welcome to Grace!** The Psalmist in today's Introit writes, "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain" (Psalm 127:1a) Today's Scripture readings point out to us God's plan for the family and suggest that even though we have not been faithful to His design, He has provided us redemption through His One and Only Son. Grace is a family of believers. That means that we are a place to gather for those who recognize the brokenness that exists in their relationship with God and one another and who need God's forgiveness found in Christ Jesus. The strength for our faith that comes through that forgiveness empowers us to live as His children. This is not an easy task. Without His grace and mercy it is impossible. We are glad that you are here! We especially welcome our visitors! We invite you to come and worship with us again.




