HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be celebrated in our 10:45 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

From today's Gospel account according to St. John we are told of a miracle by Jesus that is truly more than a miracle. It is a sign. Jesus used signs and wonders to give people a glimpse of His divinity. He is both divine and human. The changing of water into wine at a wedding in Cana in Galilee was a significant revealing of His power, so powerful a showing that His disciples believed in Him. We have seen our Lord do much more than change water into wine. In the waters of Holy Baptism He changes us from unrighteous to righteous, giving us forgiveness of our sins, rescuing us from death and the devil and giving to us the hope of eternal life.
