WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! Throughout the season of Epiphany in our Church Year, Jesus is revealed as the Son of God, the Messiah, the Savior of the world. He kept the Law perfectly in our place so that He could take our sins upon Himself and suffer death by crucifixion so that we might have forgiveness and by His resurrection have eternal life. As we grow in this knowledge of what He did for us we are empowered to reflect this Good News to others. It is indeed good for you to be here today and we invite you to come and worship with us again.

HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be celebrated in our 8:15 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

The words of St. Paul in the Epistle reading for this morning continues his discussion that contrasts the wisdom of the Gospel with human wisdom, his call as an apostle over against the philosophers of this age. Paul states that he did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as have the Greek teachers and lovers of wisdom. He came to proclaim the "mystery of God" which was revealed through the grace of God in Christ Jesus who was crucified for all. Paul decided to know nothing among the Corinthians "except Jesus Christ and Him crucified." That foolishness to the world and stumbling block for Jews is the Holy Spirit's power for faith and life. In the words of Martin Franzmann in our sermon hymn we sing, "From the cross Thy wisdom shining Breaketh forth in conquering might; From the cross forever beameth All Thy bright redeeming light. Alleluia!"
