WELCOME

Welcome to everyone! Abraham is the “Father of Faith.” By faith we, like Abraham, trust in the promises which God has revealed to us through His Word and the fulfillment of those promises in the Word made flesh, who is Jesus Christ. Our faith is fed and nourished as we gather in this place to hear the Gospel and receive God’s gifts of forgiveness and life. For that reason it is good for you to be here, members and visitors alike.

HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion is celebrated in our 10:45 Service this morning. If you are not a member of Grace and desire to receive this Sacrament of Christ’s body and blood given and shed for the forgiveness of sins, we ask that you first speak with our Pastor so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

Today’s reading from Romans begins, “Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.” (Romans 5:1) This peace includes what we usually think of as peace: the absence of animosity and warfare. Yet this peace goes even deeper. The peace we have with God through our Lord Jesus Christ is like the peace of a two-year-old asleep and draped over her mother’s shoulder—she trusts her mother, letting her limp body completely rely on her. This same kind of peace caused Paul to sing hymns while imprisoned. There is a lot to be anxious, restless, and disturbed about in our world today, yet in the midst of it all, the gift of peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ sustains us. St. Augustine famously wrote, “Our hearts are restless until they rest in You.” Lent is the Church’s invitation to the world to rest in Jesus, to find peace in the gift of being justified by faith, and thereby to experience the peace of God that surpasses all human understanding.




