WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! Hosanna! This is a word we especially hear on this day in the Church Year, but it is also a word that is spoken or sung in the liturgy during the **Sanctus** in the Service of the Sacrament. We usually do not translate this Hebrew word, but it does us well to be reminded what it means. It means “save us, we pray, O Lord.” Indeed this was the reason why Jesus came in humble birth, lived a humble life and then humbly went to Jerusalem and the cross that awaited Him there. He did so to provide salvation for us.

We especially welcome our visitors! This week we gather again for Holy Week Services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Please consider attending these Services. We ask everyone to fill out an attendance card found at each pew and return it to an Usher during the Offering. Children will be invited to come forward for a Children's Message. A nursery for infants and toddlers is located downstairs. Restrooms are also downstairs in this building or across the bridge on this floor level before entering the fellowship hall. If you have questions please ask our greeters or ushers.

HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be celebrated in the 10:45 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

Bittersweet. If something is literally bittersweet, it tastes both bitter and sweet at the same time—like a piece of dark chocolate. Different events can be bittersweet too—circumstances that are both painful and pleasant at the same time. Palm Sunday is bittersweet. As we picture Jesus riding into Jerusalem that first Palm Sunday, we don't know whether to cry or laugh. Does Jesus enter the city in lowliness or pomp? Is He coming to bow His head to die or to reign in power? The answer is bittersweet: yes! Jesus comes in both of these ways and for both of these reasons. As we enter Holy Week, however, we remember that the bitterness of Palm Sunday's humility, the bitterness of Maundy Thursday's betray, and the bitterness of Good Friday's death will undoubtedly give way to the sweetness of Easter Sunday's resurrection and life!




