WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! It is good for you to be here this morning to begin Your week strengthened by God's Word. We also hope that you will come and worship with us again. We are reminded this morning that the forgiveness of our sins came at a great price, the suffering and death of Jesus who was the "sinless One." His resurrection is the stamp of approval for His sacrifice for us and for all giving to us the hope of everlasting life and the power for being forgiving of others.

HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be celebrated in the 8:15 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

English poet Alexander Pope wrote, "To err is human; to forgive, divine." This popular saying attributes the acts of erring and forgiving to beings for which they come naturally. Humans err. God forgives. The opposite is also true. The Sacred Scriptures teach that there is no error in God, nor can there be. On the other hand, forgiveness is unnatural to humanity unless humanity becomes, as Church Father Athanasius once said, "by grace what God is by nature." This grace is given to us through the person and work of Jesus for our salvation and is exemplified for us both in Jesus' teaching and in the lives of such saints as Joseph of the "coat of many colors fame." In the Old Testament reading for today we see him forgiving his brothers who had sold him into slavery thereby leaving him for dead. In his words to his brothers he said, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive." So they were and through Christ's innocent suffering and death, so are you!

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

The Women of Grace are collecting supplies to make **School Kits** for **Lutheran World Relief.** To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. In the places where **LWR** works, even a few required supplies may be more than families can afford. <u>Items needed for each kit include:</u>

- **Four** 70-sheet notebooks of wideor college-ruled paper; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
