WELCOME

Welcome to Grace! In the Epistle reading for this morning the writer of the Letter to the Hebrews puts forth, "For the Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." God's Word of Law exposes the sin in all of us and His Word of Gospel grants us healing and comfort from our sin-sickness and empowers us to live as His redeemed and forgiven children. We are glad to have you with us this morning and pray that you will come again.

HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be celebrated in the 10:45 Service today. In this sacrament we receive Christ's very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Those who are not members of Grace are asked to speak with our Pastor before partaking of this sacrament so that the unity of faith might be established. Thank you for honoring this request.

AS WE GATHER

The rich young man from last Sunday's Gospel assumed he had done everything he needed to do to inherit eternal life. Jesus had to shake him from his reliance on his own works. Today, Jesus turns to His disciples saying two things. First, how difficult it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God. In fact, it is so difficult that "with man it is impossible." Repentance and faith are quite beyond our ability. By the work of the Holy Spirit, we turn to receive the kingdom of God as a gift on the basis of the atonement of Christ for us. When we get conversion and salvation straight, we will be more aware of what a miracle it is that we can say, "I believe." Then faith produces works that in keeping with what we confess. The Gospel and its power is responsible for both our faith and its response.
