AS WE GATHER

The Church Year is rapidly coming to an end. Today is the next to last Sunday of our current year and we hear the great promise we confess confidently every Sunday: "the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting." Our greatest fear is death, but in our Baptisms we are given forgiveness of sins and eternal salvation.
