**AS WE GATHER**

Once again this morning in our Gospel reading we have Jesus speaking in parables. He does not explain the parables this week as He has in the parables of the last two weeks' Gospel readings. Although most commentators identify the hidden treasure and pearl of great price as the Kingdom of God, what if we are those treasures? In this morning's Old Testament reading Moses told the people before they entered the Promised Land, "The Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for His treasured possession." Then we see Jesus as the one finding us and giving up all that He has for us, as indeed our Lord gave His very life so that we might be with Him forever. These are comforting words for everyone baptized into Christ like Avery Jo Calvillo who will be baptized this morning in the 10:45 Service. We can be sure that nothing "will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." What a great promise assuring us of our heavenly Father's great love for us!


