WELCOME

Today we celebrate the Festival of Pentecost, the culmination of the Easter celebration. The resurrected Christ, having shown Himself to His disciples and having ascended to the right hand of the Father, sends the promised gift of the Holy Spirit to the young expectant Church. It is the Holy Spirit who uses the Means of Grace, Word and Sacrament, to create and sustain faith and thereby enlarge the Church. The Church continues to carry out the Great Commission of baptizing in the name of the Triune God and teaching everything that the Lord has commanded us to teach so that it might be the source of living water for those who are spiritually thirsty.

Welcome to everyone gathered here this day for worship. We ask that everyone fill out an attendance registration card found at each pew and return it to an Usher as the Offering is collected. Children are welcome in our Service and will be invited to come forward for a Children's Message. Parents may accompany them. A nursery for infants and toddlers is located downstairs for anyone who has need. We invite you to come and worship with us again.

AS WE GATHER

Come Holy Spirit! Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian Church. This celebration takes place 50 days after Easter (the word Pentecost means 50th day). On this day the Holy Spirit was poured out in a powerful way on Jesus' disciples to enable them to proclaim the Gospel and to bring peace in the midst of the confusion of man's sinfulness.

In John 14, Jesus says, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." The primary role of the Holy Spirit then is to teach us and remind us of all that Jesus said. When Peter had confessed Jesus to be the Messiah, Jesus said immediately to Peter: "the son of Man must suffer many things...be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Luke 9:22). Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. This is the word that the Holy Spirit reminds us of week after week in Scripture, hymns, preaching and Holy Communion. It is this word of Jesus that brings us down a notch when we are arrogant and lifts us up when we are brought low by our sin. Christ, crucified for sinners and risen, is the focus of our faith and witness. This is precisely what the Holy Spirit teaches us and brings to our remembrance to give us peace and an eternal hope.






